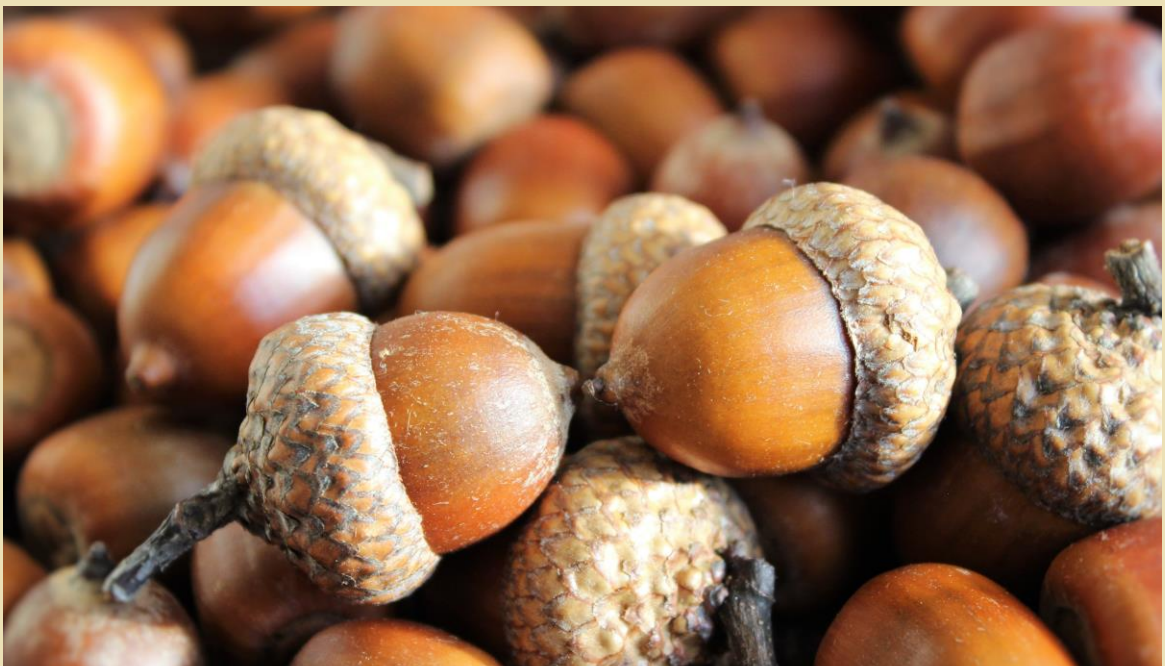


## Wool Acorns



Bring some nature and colour into your home or style with your very own wool acorns, perfect for decorating your home or creating jewellery.



These woollen acorns can be used to make lots of things to decorate the house or create some jewellery for a unique style.

### What you'll need

- Brightly coloured wool roving
- Acorn cups
- Liquid hand soap
- Warm water
- Big mixing bowl
- PVA glue
- String (optional)

## What to do/instructions:

- Go on a woodland walk and collect some acorns. You'll find them underneath oak trees from around September to early November
- Carefully remove the acorn caps
- In a bowl, mix a little hand soap with some warm water
- Pull apart a small handful of wool and dip into the soapy water and roll in our hands. Keep dipping the wool in the water until it fuses together to make small balls
- Once you have created your balls, leave them to dry - preferably overnight
- When your woollen balls are dry, glue them into the acorn caps.

## Some ideas:

Make some bunting by threading some string through your woollen acorns. These also make great tinsel alternatives at Christmas.

Make some jewellery from these woollen acorns. You can make some earrings, necklaces and bracelets by threading some jewellery wire through the acorn caps before glue the woollen balls.
